- Declaring any personal interests in company transactions.

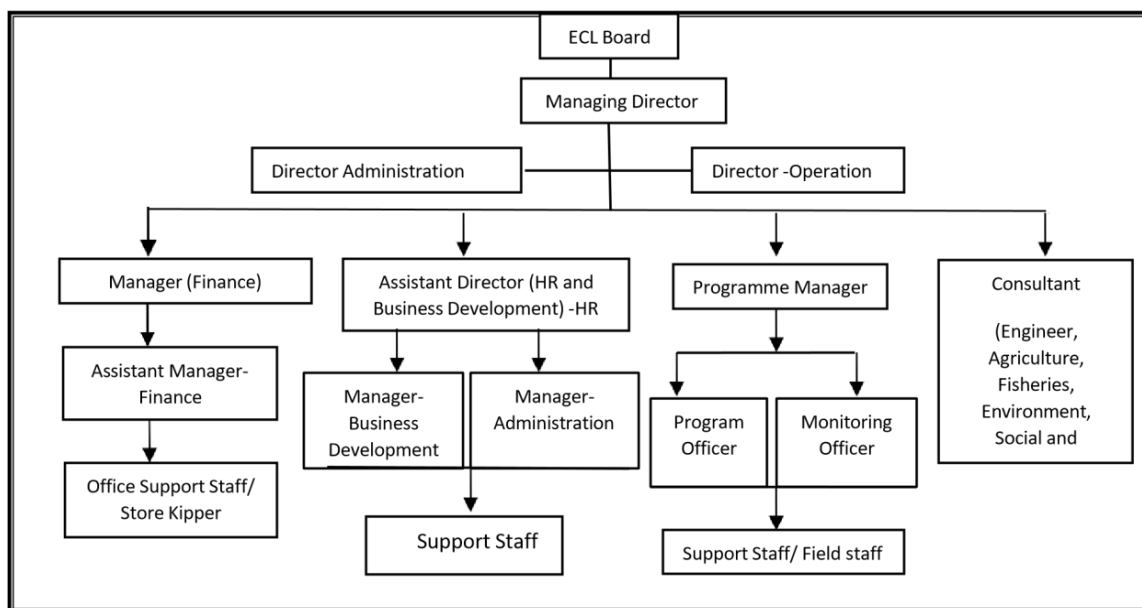


Human Resources

- **S - Sensitivity of the Market Risk:** The degree to which changes in interest rates, exchange rates, and commodity prices negatively affect earnings.
